- Visiting exchange students can take a maximum of 15 EC (usually 3 courses of 5 EC each) from the master program in Population Studies (as well as other courses from other programs), subject to prior approval from the master program coordinator

A student's workload is measured in ECTS credits. According to Dutch law, one credit represents 28 hours of work and 60 credits represents one year of full-time study. The academic year lasts 42 weeks.

The grading system used in the Netherlands is on a scale from 1 (very poor) to 10 (outstanding). The lowest passing grade is 6; 9s are seldom given and 10s are extremely rare. Grades 1-3 are hardly ever used. The above scale is used for all types of evaluations/examinations. The letter O stands for 'onvoldoende' (failure); it indicates a student has submitted at least one, but not all assignments required for the course. End marks for courses are delivered in round figures (e.g., 10, 9, 8, 7 or

6). Partial marks for assignments, papers, exams are available for course participants, but are not included on transcripts.
