- 2. The receiving institution will send its decision within [5] weeks.
- 3. A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than [5] weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI.
- 4. Termination of the agreement

In the event of unilateral termination, a notice of at least one academic year should be given. This means that a unilateral decision to discontinue the exchanges notified to the other party by 1 September 20XX will only take effect as of 1 September 20XX+1. "Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict."

1-10	Utrecht University uses a ten-point grading scale, in which 10 is the highest grade. Grades of 6 and up count as a pass. A grade of 10 is awarded only for exceptionally good work.
Final grades	Final grades obtained for course modules will be rounded off to one decimal place, except in the case of a 5 or 6:
	- Final grades between 4.95 and 5.49 will be rounded off to a 5 (unsatisfactory).
	- Final grades between 5.50 and 5.99 will be rounded off to a 6 (pass).
	Grades for component parts of course modules will not be rounded off.
NV/NS	You did not attend the course module (no show).
NVD/NC	You did not complete all the compulsory component parts of the course module.
ND	A preliminary final grade. This means that you were unable to take a test due to circumstances beyond your control
